WHAT CAN ACSS DO FOR YOU?



INTELLECTUAL AND/OR DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES COMMUNITY LIVING SUPPORTS

Individuals who experience intellectual and/or developmental disabilities and their families often share a common set of goals:

- Living a happy, everyday life
- Being respected and treated as an equal
- Exploring a life that is about positive relationships, opportunities, rights, and responsibilities
- About being a valued member of your community
 Of making a positive contribution to those around you.

We at ACSS want to help you make progress with the things that are most important to you, and supporting you as you work towards accomplishing those goals!

HOW OUR PROCESS WORKS

Upon contact, our team will assess what services an individual is eligible to receive. We then:

- Provide a thorough and personalized assessment to include reviewing any available records and information
- We speak with the Service Coordinators and the individuals (or parents/guardians/representative) to discuss the individuals unique Individual Support Plan (ISP) and supporting documents
- We'll discuss the desired hours/days for assistance, as well as any other concerns.

After this assessment, ACSS will then match individuals with an appropriate DSP(s) and schedule a "Meet and Greet". After a mutually successful introduction, ACSS will schedule support hours to begin as appropriate.

WHEN WORKING WITH ACSS, YOU CAN EXPECT:

- We will get to know you to learn about your needs
- You will be able to talk about your goals and support needs. We will also discuss how you'd like those services delivered
- You will meet the people who provide these services and can choose who will help you meet your needs and achieve your goals!

WHAT SERVICES ARE AVAILABLE FOR CHILDREN?

Based on your needs and goals, services that may be available to your child may include:

- Relief care for family caregivers
- Training to help you meet your child's needs
- Help with everyday activities like preparing meals, bathing or feeding your child
- We work with and support Children's Intensive In-Home Services (CIIS) Programs for children with very complex medical and/or behavioral support needs

WHAT SERVICES ARE AVAILABLE FOR ADULTS?

Based on your needs and goals, services available to you may include:

- Support with everyday activities like bathing, dressing, shopping, meal prep, managing your money, behavior and communication challenges.
- Support an individuals' integration into their community.

WHAT SETS ACSS APART?

Person-Centered activities (planning, tools, and approaches) to assist people to express what is important to them, how they want to be supported, and how they want to live.

ACSS prides itself on utilizing Person Centered Practices (PCP), a method which assists in matching a supported individual with an appropriate DSP. It is critical for us to communicate directly with the individual - or their representative - to discuss what criteria they feel would be the most suitable fit. Sometimes this can look like a request for a male or female DSP, a certain age range, or even that the DSP be bilingual. Daily routines are typically important for supported individuals and unexpected change can be very upsetting and difficult. We believe that staff matching is not only critical for a successful relationship, but it also helps prevent excessive personnel turnover.

Identifying the best match for an individual with a DSP is not only a goal - it's a primary focus!

IT'S YOUR PLAN AND YOUR CHOICE

You are in charge and you plan your services and supports. You can choose to have a legal representative, family member or friend help you. You build your support plan that includes your services based on your goals, what is important to you, and your assessed needs. You will decide which of the qualifying services will help you live a healthy, safe and productive life.
